









Try as much as he may, they would not take heed and listen to his words and no one cared to answer his call.


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

As the punishment got closer to them, they cried louder and louder begging for God's Mercy and with utmost humility asked Him to accept their repentance.


They cried and cried until God accepted their repentance and ceased the punishment that was to descend upon them and instead diverted it to the mountains of Mosul.








God then responded to his prayer and commanded the fish to cast up Jonah onto the dry land.

God says:


"So We responded to him and delivered him from the grief, and thus do We deliver the believers."

God says:


"And they believed, so We gave them provision for an appointed time."
